“Eddie was on his way to high school on a blue-sky morning. Then he was bleeding to death in front of me, lying on the operating table with his belly open and filled with blood.”

And so begins Stephen Cohn M.D.’s memoir ***All Bleeding Stops: Life and Death in the Trauma Unit***, which we will publish on July 1st, 2024.

From classics like *ER* and *Grey's Anatomy* to newer fan favorites such as *Chicago Med*, *The Good Doctor*, and *Breathtaking*, medical dramas continue to persevere. These series have risen to prominence by intertwining storytelling with ethical dilemmas, social commentary, and educational insights into the world of healthcare. Stephen Cohn provides all this, only with a twist—factual insight into being a trauma surgeon.

All Bleeding Stops exposes the aftermath of accidents related to not wearing a seatbelt or forgetting a helmet to outside violence from gunshot, stabbing, and animal attack wounds. Patients entering the trauma wing are full of unknowns, with undetermined extent of their injuries and the absence of medical history records; this leaves one common acknowledgement: to be a trauma surgeon is to realize that “all bleeding eventually ceases.” With first-hand stories from medical residency, army field surgeon deployment, training fellows in Israel, and working in U.S. trauma units, Cohn reveals his successes and losses over four decades of experience.

Stephen Cohn, M.D., is a former surgeon in the U.S. Army Medical Corp in Desert Storm, past Division Chief of Trauma and Surgical Critical Care at Yale University School of Medicine, past Medical Director of the Ryder Trauma Center in Miami, past Chairman of the Department of Surgery at the University of Texas Health Science Center, and current practitioner in New York City. He has also lent his knowledge as an educator and researcher, having produced more than 300 scientific publications, edited eight surgical textbooks, conducted extensive funded research, participated in many professional organizations, and served as an editorial reviewer for numerous journals.

We’ll be sending Stephen Cohn, M.D., on a ten-city tour to promote his book: Boston, New Haven, New York, Chicago, Minneapolis, Miami, Houston, Seattle, San Francisco, and Los Angeles.
